Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ Jesus,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body & Blood of Christ, also known as Corpus Christi Sunday.

In our missals the writers have come to call it the “**MOST HOLY** Body and Blood of Christ”. When I was a younger priest it was simply the “Body & Blood of Christ”. Why this seemingly slight change in the name?

Perhaps it is because the bishops of our country, and indeed the world, have come to understand that there are more than a few Catholics who do not quite understand this very central and fundamental truth of our faith. That truth is that when we as Catholics speak about the Eucharist, Holy Communion, we truly believe, as Jesus himself said, that this bread and this wine, these simple elements of the earth, are indeed the Body and Blood of Christ. It is the true and real and substantial presence of Jesus Christ.

Yes, it is a symbol for us insomuch that the bread and wine do not change their form, so they do not change in appearance or material. But our understanding moves very much beyond mere symbol to real essence. This basic food for humanity has now become the spiritual food for us. Christ himself nourishes us body and soul.

May we always hunger and thirst for this beautiful gift that our Savior gave to us at the Last Supper. May we also remember that no matter what we name the Eucharist, it is always most holy, because the Eucharist is Christ.

Advantages of donating electronically to your parish family

Electronic giving replaces 52 decisions to give weekly. 38% of Catholics decide what they will give on the basis of what is in their checkbook on a given Sunday. Stewardship giving is thoughtful, planned, proportionate and sacrificial. Donating electronically automatically makes you a thoughtful giver.

More important than frequency is faithfulness. You are 100% faithful when you give with your weekly envelope or electronically make an offering. You also provide a more steady flow of income for your parish.

Giving is a public expression of faith. Dropping an envelope into the basket at offertory time shows your participation in your parish. You may write "I give electronically" on your envelope. Your gift still comes from your heart. [as found in Catholic Messenger, Sept. 17]
